Care Home

Nursing and non-nursing residential care.



Typically operating at **1 location**.



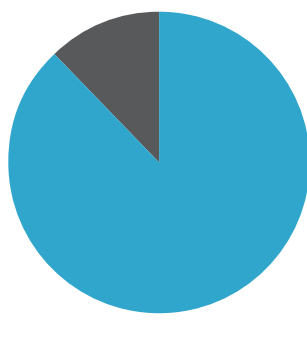
35 staff (FTE).



Average **40 beds**.



Operates in converted building (former vicarage) with maybe small extension.



Average occupancy **88%**.



41% self funders, **45%** LA funded, **15%** LA funded with top-up.



Owner managed.



Average fees **£749 pw** (LA pays **£555 pw**).

Homecare Providers

Independent or franchised.



1 to 100+ registered CQC locations.



40+ staff per location.



600 to 3,500+ hours of care per location per week.



50+ customers per location.



National or regional presence.



Funding split between local authority and private fee payers.



Owner operated.



Mixed profitability.

Retirement Communities

Extra care provider.



1-15 registered CQC locations.



10-45 staff per location.



1-20+ hours of care per location per week.



40+ customers per location.



National, smaller regional and local providers.



Various combinations of state funded and private funding.



Private, registered/housing associations and charitable providers.



Private, **affordable** rent and/or mixed tenure.

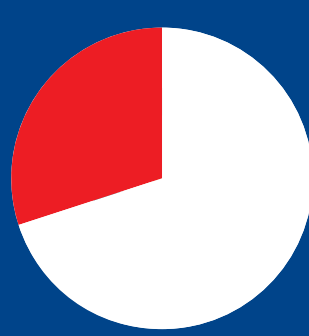
Shared Lives Schemes

Shared lives schemes make up **0.85%** of social care provision.

Schemes supports people with **learning disabilities** (inc. health and non-health needs).



97% rated Good or Outstanding by CQC.



10k shared lives carers in England – **30%** male **70%** female.



Support provided in people's **own homes**.



Supports **90 people** at each scheme.



7 staff per scheme.



All schemes funded by **local authority**.



68% LA and **32%** independently managed.



Fees range from **£391** to **£487** per week.
